Meeting Program

The streaming version of the seminar contains a total of six hours of video, broken down into chapters, with each chapter followed by a summary, further reading, and proposed exercises, all designed to move the tremendous amount of information from short-term to long-term memory.

In Day 2, the subject matter delves into the technical aspects of digital photography. The video course cuts through the confusion and gives you everything you need to know to start shooting confidently, improve your creativity, deepen your technical understanding, and give you the means to realize the shot you have in your head.

Day 2 ("The Technical Stuff")

- How your exposure meter thinks (or "Why can't the camera just make it look the way I see it?")
- The three variables of exposure, explained intuitively.
- The three types of metering, and which ones are actually useful.
- The RAW vs. JPG dilemma explained without religious fervor
- Histograms, explained intuitively.
- How to avoid horrific .jpg compression artifacts
- The important problem of print vs. screen resolution
- The only eight Post-processing functions I use
- How to cut through haze
- How to clean dirty windows
- Saving Lenin with Curves
- Make Stuff Go Away
- Recommended Unsharp Mask values
- Expanding Dynamic Range using RAW.

Each day is broken up into easily digestible video "chapters", along with summary and exercises between chapters to reinforce what was learned and to help move the lessons into long-term memory.

Creating Canvas Gallery Wrapped Images with Mirrored Sides



Most of my home printing is on canvas. I like the look, ease of hanging and low frame costs. This article is a brief overview of the process I use. There are many ways to do this and you can create your own method to suit your displaying wants. The wrap and stapling area enter into the final printing dimensions. The examples below are for a 10x15 frame built using ¾" wood frame, and using a mirrored wrap.

1. Prepare the Image for Printing

First determine the printable area on the canvas needed for the front, the wrap and some overhang on the back for stapling. For each side, I like to have $\frac{1}{2}$ " of the print extend over the frame edge and then another $\frac{1}{2}$ " of white canvas for stapling. Extra is not a problem. Thus, for 10x15, the final canvas size will be at least 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".


Size the image to the frame size (10x15 in this example)



2. Add Wrap to the Image

Next add the wrap. Use your editing software to add a wrap to the image. Essentially this increases the canvas size to make room for the wrap. In some cases, you might want to not add a wrap and have the image flow naturally over the edge. Some wrap styles are mirroring, stretching, and solid color. A nice mirroring script for Photoshop is at https://www.teckelworks.com/photography/tools/.

Once the script is on your computer, in Photoshop, File | Scripts | Browse to select the script.



34 wrap + 14 for staple => 1"

.25 is the $\frac{1}{4}$ " white staple area



This script has alignment lines (in the white) for transferring to the rear of the canvas.

The dotted lines to not print but show you where the mirroring starts.

3. Print

I use Chromata White canvas from Breathing Color. I buy a small roll and cut as needed. Many companies supply canvas (Red River, Moab, etc.). The canvas supplier will provide the printer profile and print settings for your printer. Be sure to have Photoshop manage printer color.

4. Build Frame

Hobby Lobby sells wooden frame sections or you can build your own from decent pine or plywood. The frame size should be the size of the front of the image (10x15 in the first example). I used mitered corners.

5. Stretch Canvas onto Frame

I spray the print with a sealer. I use Kamar Varnish from Krylon (Hobby Lobby is one source). After it is dry, I clip the corners, this helps reduce the amount of canvas being folded and makes for tighter corners.



I transfer the lines on the print to the back side of the canvas to help me align the frame and canvas. Since these image sizes are fairly small, a lot of stretching is not needed. I use a pair of canvas pliers, but other types of pliers would likely work as well. I use an electric stapler to affix the canvas on the back of the frame.

I fold the canvas like a wrapping a present, then use the stapler from the middle out on one side. Then do the opposite side. And lastly the two ends.

You can hang the framed image directly on a hook or add a wire to the back.

6. Miscellaneous

• I have printed a canvas as a triptych. This gave me a viewable size of 30 x 15.



• Normal Framing

You may want to print the canvas without a wrap and then place it in a frame like a paper print. This gives a nice oil painting effect.

• Examples of various dimensions for a small format printer:


The last is the biggest I can print on my 13x19 printer.




