Cover Image

Title: Night Dream

At our Oct 12 2017 meeting, Lee did an informal talk on his techniques for star trails.

- Preparation before the shoot includes putting all of the night's equipment into a white bag. Make sure you have all necessary equipment, lens warmer, head lamp, hand warmers, intervalometer, extra batteries, gloves, hat, snack:
- The white bag makes easier to find in total darkness this also lets him use his camera bag as a weight for the tripod to increase stability.
- Show up before sunset to compose the image.
- Stay away from the camera while the sequence is shooting.
- Technical
 - Intervalometer set to 3 minutes with 1 second between shots (the longer exposure allows for a lower ISO and smaller aperture). It will not affect the brightness of the stars (they are 'moving'), but the background will have a longer exposure.
 - If you are around water or have a high Dew Point, you may need to use a lens warmer to prevent lens fogging. I use a sock with two hand warmers in the sock then wrap it around the lens held by a big rubber band.
 - o Camera on bulb
 - o ISO 1600
 - o RAW
 - Manual focus on a bright star using live view, once focused use gaffers tape (leaves no residue) to secure focus ring.
 - Aperture 5.6 or 7.1 lens sweet spot
 - Static white balance (4500)

- Turn off any noise reduction
- Reduce night blindness by lowering or turning down the brightness on the viewing screen
- Do a first image with the lens cap on and a last image with the cap on (black images)
- Before the first exposure close the view finder eye piece. Leave it closed during the sequence so light will not enter from the back of the camera.
- Post Processing
 - ACR or other raw processor Select all and do the lens profile all images, Including your black frames
 - Remove airplane lights, shooting stars for each individual image.
 - Do not process any images in the RAW processor at this time. ONLY do lens profile and airplane clean up. You will process latter.
 - Open all images in PS and use image processor to save all as JPEG.
 - Open JPEG's in StarStaX, Open the black image frames separately.
 - Use StarStaX in comet mode and use the black images
 - Save file in StarStaX as TIFF
 - Now you have one image you reprocess the TIFF in ACR
 - To get white snow, in ACR, use the brush to select the snow and set it's saturation to 0. Snow often picks up other colors.

Star Trail Photography

Camera and settings:

With both images, I used a SonyA6000, with a 19mm Sigma lens, Aperture set at F 2.8, ISO at 1600, and manual focusing.

The intervalometer was set for a 30 second exposure with a 2 second delay between shots.

For the image of the tree with the Aurora in the background, Doug Goodman and I were at Peoh Pt, CleElum. Doug assisted with the camera and intervalometer settings and we captured approx. 90 images.

We positioned the camera towards the North Star. It was operating on its own for about an hour, while we were capturing the Milky Way to the South. Of course I forgot about it and several times inadvertently opened the car trunk to get equipment ...didn't realize I was light painting.

I followed the same procedure with the Mt Baker location but I started with a much lower ISO. I had to interrupt the image capturing to set the ISO to 1600. The result showed a blurring of the trees in the image.

I uploaded all images to Lightroom and deleted the images I did not want.

I downloaded the free StarStax software on the iMac and followed the steps provided in a YouTube video. It was a simple import of approx. 90 images into Starstax to produce each image. I exported as jpegs and then imported the final image from StarStax into Lightroom for some final editing.

There is a way to export images saved as TIFFs into StarStax then re import into Photoshop and still have all the raw data.

Other tips/methods:

- The Sony A6000 is a 1.5 crop which is very similar to Nikon and Canon cropped sensors. The 19mm lens is equivalent to around 30mm for full frame cameras.
- If you are using 30 second exposures, a simple external shutter release can also be used.
 Use the 'lock' position on the release and set the camera to 30 second exposure and multiple exposures.
- In some cases, a 'base' photo can be taken to exposed the background separately and even in different light conditions (i.e. alpenglow).

Submitting Images for Competition
