## End of Year Awards

The Image Of The Year (IOY) Banquet is held every year in late February or early March. Activities at the banquet include the showing of images entered in three annual competitions (Image of the Year AKA IOY, Assigned Subject and Wildflower), the presentation of awards, certificates and trophies and a program.

#### **Image Of The Year Competition**

Club members may enter three images in the Pilchuck Camera Club's annual Image Of The Year competition. These images must have been entered in monthly club competition in the previous calendar year (January through December).

#### **Annual Assigned Subject Competition**

Each year the club members choose an annual Assigned Subject category. Club members may enter three images in this annual competition. The images must have been taken during the previous calendar year (January through December).

#### **Wildflower Competition**

The 'Wildflower' Competition was originally named the Violet Johnson Wildflower Award in honor of Violet Johnson, a charter member of Pilchuck Camera Club. In 1995, the competition was renamed the Wildflower Award.

Very artistic, unusual portrait. Interesting lighting and subject. Great sharp focus.




## Honorable Mention "Female Osprey" by Sherrie Tallman

## 1st Place Subject of the Year! Patterns in Nature "Dew Drops" by Renee Deierling

Tech excellent. Imaginative approach. Green pops off the page; love how the dew drops line the leaves. Contrast between leaf and bubbles is very uniform.



# 2nd Place Subject of the Year! Patterns in Nature "Patterns in Death Valley" by Tracy Carson

Great use of light and shadow. Beautiful subject. Like the layers and contrasting textures. Lighting and shadows bring out impressions of rock.



# 3rd Place Subject of the Year! Patterns in Nature "Sooty Grouse" by Debbie Smith

Tech well done. Good use of focus to help bird stand out from background. Nice detail, color, and bokeh. Would have scored higher if the bird had been doing something. Good demonstration of camouflage, good catch light in eye.

Tech well done. Interesting choice of patterns. Sharp, good detail. Good patterns and focus.

# Honorable Mention- Subject of the Year Patterns in Nature "Prickly Pattern" by Tracy Carson

Rule of odds nice pattern, lost detail in the shadows, Good lighting of 3 flowers, crop on left achieves good balance.



# Honorable Mention- Subject of the Year Patterns in Nature "Sea Anemone" by Sherrie Tallman

Fascinating pattern, good detail, midtones seem a little flat. Very well focused, no reflections, good lighting.



Striking color. Nice comp and selective focus. Love the angled depth of field because it places emphasis on the most visually appealing part of the plant; great colors and detail. Fantastic bokeh, great color/balance; very good focus.

Looks 3D. Gorgeous color and great comp. Nice composition and bokeh; the dewdrops take it up a notch for me. Classic lupine with sky, good color.

Technically great. Dramatic use of light. The contrasting primary colors and variations in texture draw me in. Good lighting on flowers.



### **Calypso Orchid 2022**


### **By Steve Lightle**

The soft, monochromatic colors combined with a very shallow depth of field draw me in. Soft petals in background compliment petals in foreground.



## Honorable Mention Wildflower Indian Thistle By Kevin Siefke

Technically fine. Bravo for capturing the thistle at this stage in its life; great detail; the background is generally very good but there are a couple of light spots that are distracting. Great focus; purple draws attention to center.
