Blue ribbons were awarded for slides receiving honorable mention: Arne Ervig received a blue ribbon in the Scenic Division for "Sunset Sky" and one in the General Division for "Introducing the Beatles" (a photo of seed pods of the Anemone). Sag Anderson also won a blue ribbon in the Closeup Division for "Lotus Flower on Sandstone." "Tanks for the Beer" by Mrs. Ed Appelgren and "Up to the Light" by Ed Appelgren received blue ribbons in the General Division.

## 'Creative Eye' Topic for Camera Club

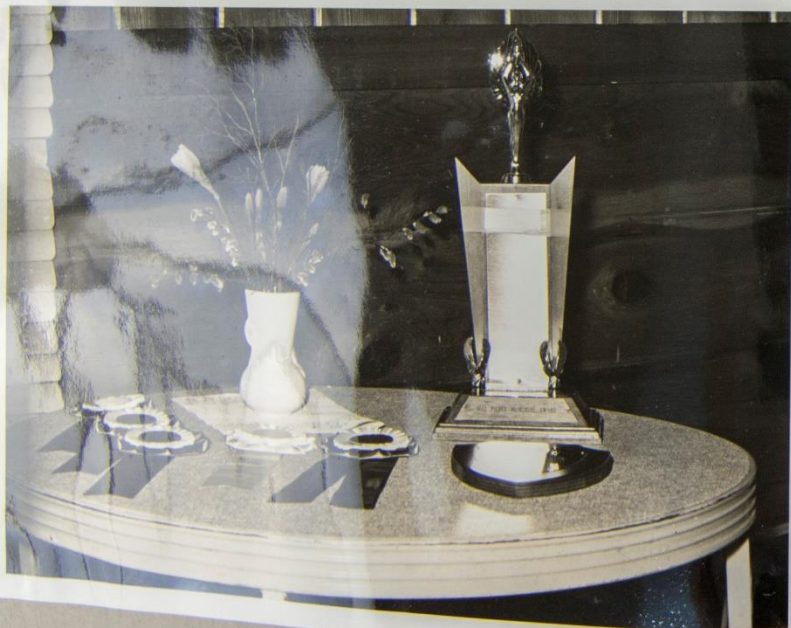

Her favorite spot for finding wildflowers is Washington Park at Anacortes in the early spring. The first new flowers of the year can be found there, she explained.

She also fancies the Okanogan area where she trout fishes when she isn't focusing on Eastern Washington flora.

Known around Everett as a long-time employee of Benson's Camera, she has ended what she calls "13 years in the darkroom." She is semi-retired as it is called when one plans to work part-time and avoid the rocking chair.

Among her list of camera club and other memberships, Vi is an Everett Mountaineer. Two weeks ago she led a beach walk on Camano Island, and in the summer she goes on nine-mile hikes and the like with the club.

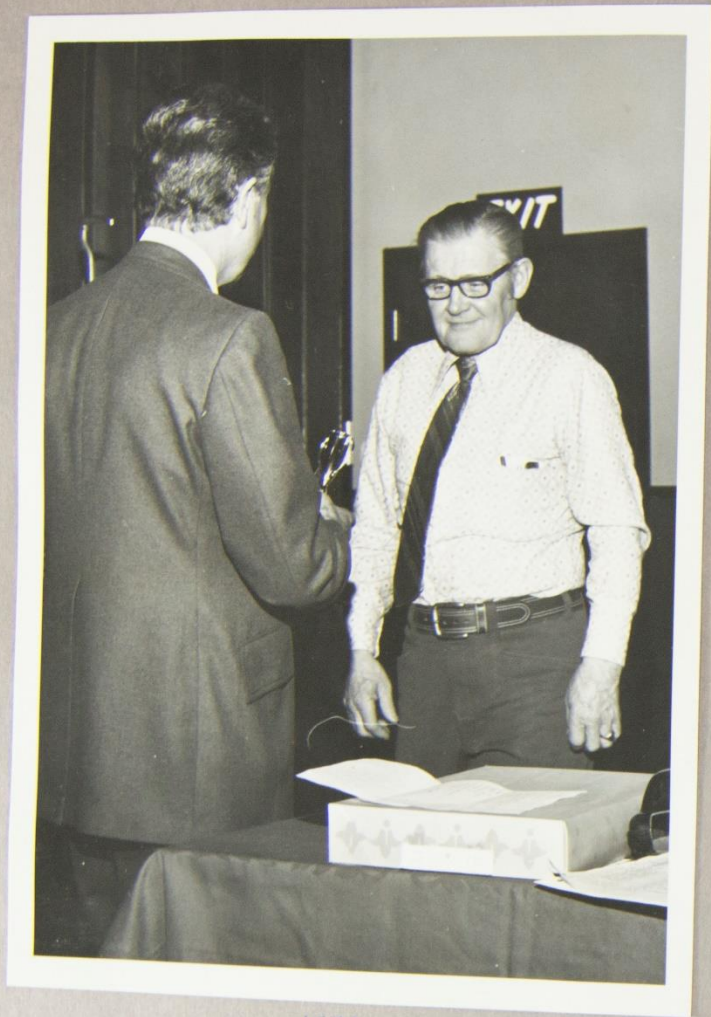










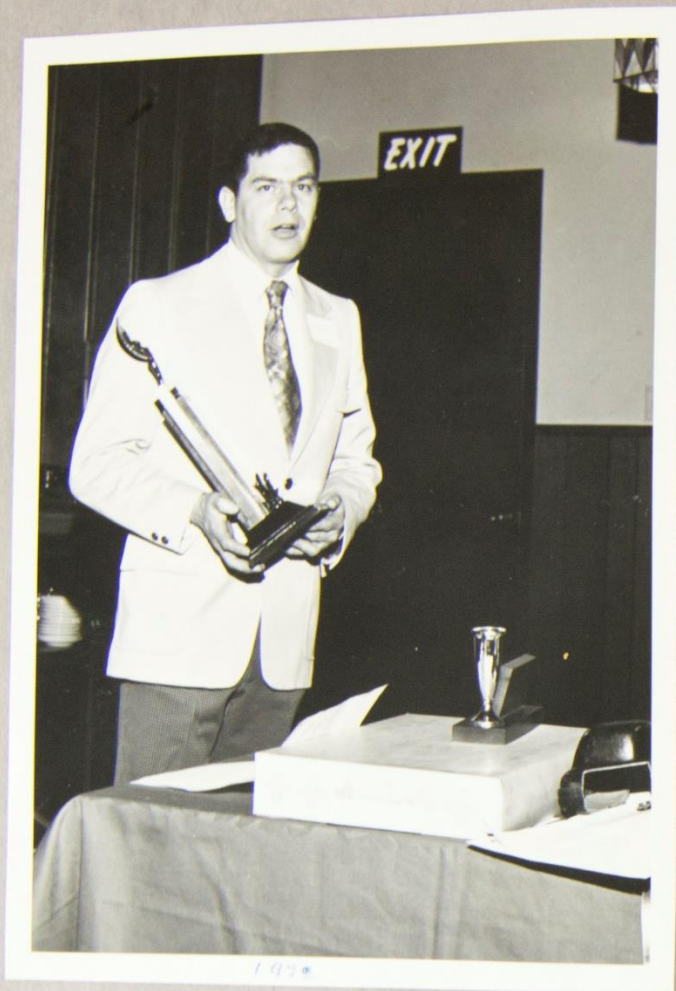

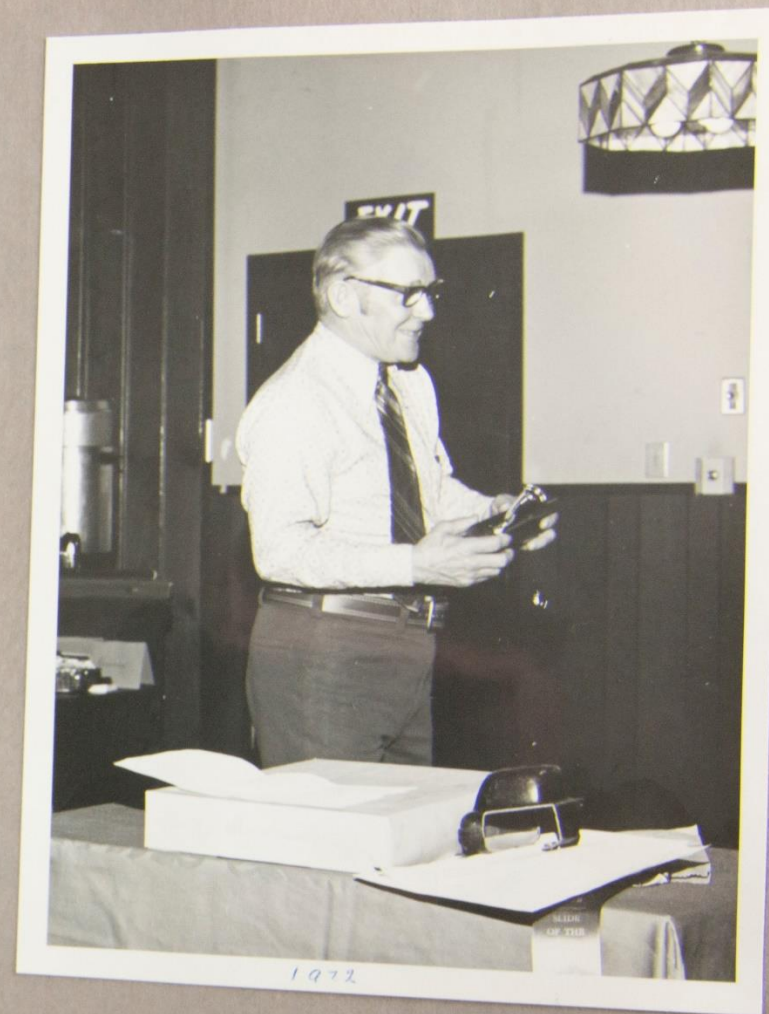

NWCCC TRAVELING SLIDE & PRINT SHOWS

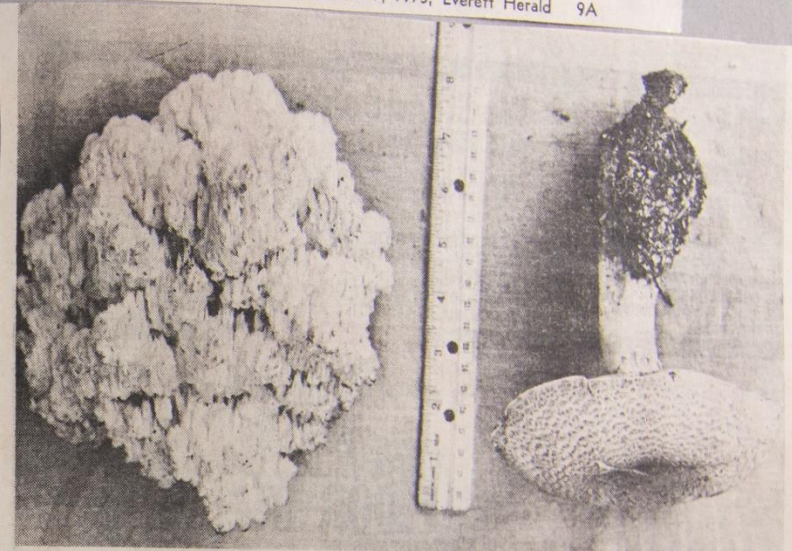

Coral mushrooms are large fruiting bodies with many branches that appear as long white teeth hanging. They are attached to wood by a stout thick stalk. usually in old Douglas fir forests on fallen logs and stumps. Young plants are compact, soon spreading

into large pure white to yellowish clusters sometimes 3-4 pounds. "The Prince," one of the choice agarics to be found in this region, thrives near compost heaps, flower beds, lawns and orchards. From June to October the creamy white to tan cap with close pressed, brown scales 5-17 inches wide appears. The gills at first creamy white then dull rose change to purplish brown. She was a world traveller and an excellent photographer, having received a 500 point Achievement Award certificate in 1972..... We will miss her.

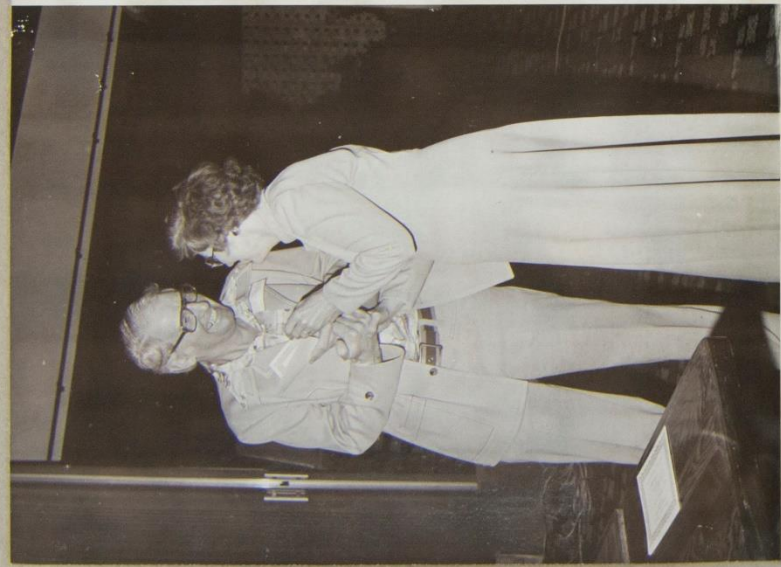

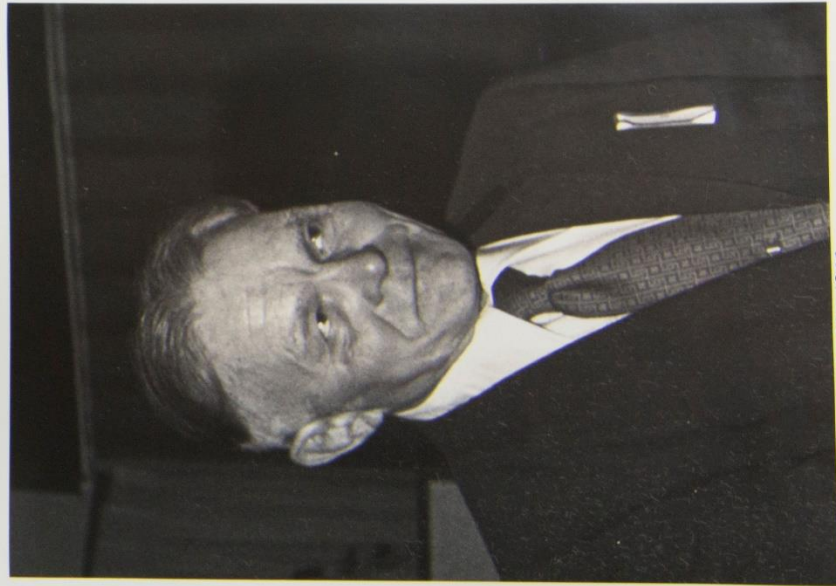

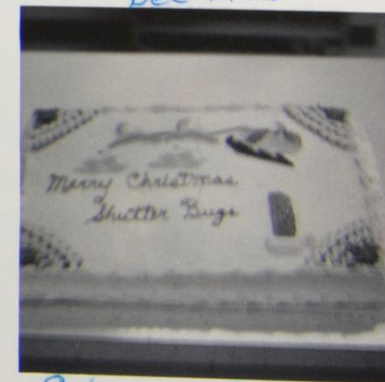

Clarence A. Sorgen, 88, of 4813 Dogwood Drive, Everett, died June 19 in a Seattle hospital.

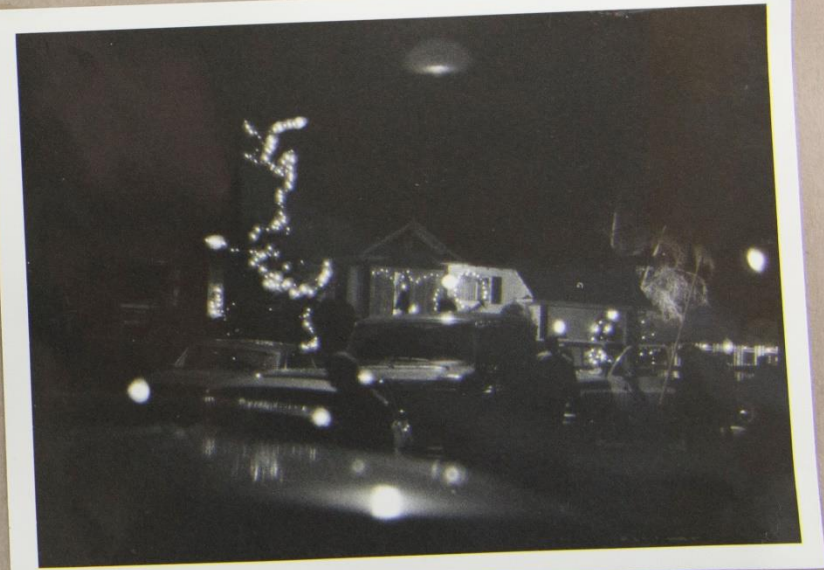

## Flood victims dressed formal for pot luck

INDEX — William and Eleanor Wojnich were a bit overdressed for recent potluck-and-slide-show party to raise funds for victims of the flood that demolished part of the town last month, but they didn't seem to care.

Mr. Wojnich wore a tuxedo and Mrs. Wojnich wore a formal gown. But for good reason. They lost all their possessions when the rampaging Skykomish River washed their home away — except two tuxedos which were found in a muddy, soaked suit bag downriver from Index. When they were returned to him Mr. Wojnich vowed to have one cleaned and to wear it to the first public function in Index. That was the potluck and slide show held last Saturday. While the Wojnitches were formal, most of the other party-goers wore jeans.

The slide show was organized by William and Louise Sumner to show how the town was damaged by the flood. Eight houses were totally destroyed and some 500 feet of a street was washed away by the raging water.

Nearly \$300 was raised through donations taken at the door, according to Index Emergency Coordinator Barbara McDonald.
